Position:	AmeriCorps Land Stewardship Trainer
Location: Desired Start Date:	Bend, OR and Prineville, OR. Project locations throughout Central Oregon. Late April/Early May
Position Summary:	The Heart of Oregon Corps is seeking a Land Stewardship Trainer! The AmeriCorps Land Stewardship Trainers will complete 1700 hours of service over 9 months (April - December). Under the direction of the Project Coordinator, the Land Stewardship Trainer position will provide training and support alongside part-time AmeriCorps service members while also completing environmental stewardship service. This includes: developing and implementing in-field training opportunities; environmental education lessons; field logistics support; and project partner satisfaction tracking. This position will have a special emphasis on helping members practice technical field skills as well as conservation education while also encouraging a safe service environment. She/he, along with the Transition Specialist, will also track member development and training opportunities.
Specific Duties:	<ul> <li>Develop and deliver program curriculum for environmental education and stewardship; effectively implement these trainings for part-time corpsmembers throughout their service.</li> <li>Assist with tool/equipment/vehicle inventory tracking and maintenance</li> <li>Assist with summer spike camping trips. Must be available to camp throughout the spring and summer season.</li> <li>Assist in the delivery of other program services as assigned to the extent that it is not in conflict with the primary position responsibilities or any AmeriCorps provision including the AmeriCorps Prohibited Activities.</li> </ul>
Benefits:	<ul> <li>Assist in the delivery of other program services as assigned.</li> <li>A maximum taxable \$12,630 (pre-tax) living allowance dispersed bi-weekly over 40 weeks.</li> <li>Basic medical insurance (health and dental for member only).</li> <li>Paid Federal holidays, sick time, and vacation days.</li> <li>Student loan forbearance (for qualifying federal student loans).</li> <li>A \$5,920 education award granted upon successful completion of the program.</li> <li>Potential professional development and training opportunities including: Wilderness First Aid, career planning, volunteer management, public land stewardship, &amp; youth development.</li> <li>Opportunity to live, travel, and serve in Central Oregon.</li> </ul>
Physical Requirements:	Frequent lifting and carrying of up to 50 lbs. Standing, walking, bending, hiking for long hours. Ability to work outside in all weather conditions, including extreme heat, cold, and rain. Ability to drive 10 passenger vans and 4WD drive vehicles. Ability to pull and back up trailers safely (or ability to learn).
Travel:	Position requires frequent local travel in HOC vehicles. Occasional overnight travel required. Occasional use of personal vehicle with mileage reimbursement required. Must not have any major traffic violations or citations.
Age Minimum:	Must be 17 years old of age to apply.
